I am writing to advise you that the Wybunbury Combined Parishes Draft Neighbourhood Plan has been published for consultation by Hough & Chorlton Parish Council. The Draft Neighbourhood Plan has been prepared by a neighbourhood plan steering group of parish councillors (from all four parish councils) and interested residents on behalf of the four Wybunbury Ward Parish Councils. The Draft Neighbourhood Plan has been directly informed following questionnaire surveys of local residents and businesses in 2017 and 2018 and informal public consultations on the emerging Draft Plan.

The consultation period runs for 6 weeks from 4th February 2019 to 18th March 2019.
